Princeton Day Academy (Lanham, MD) and head coach Van Whitfield are pleased to announce that 6'2" point guard **Jamaur Jackson** has signed a National Letter of Intent to further his education and play basketball for Nyack College in Nyack, NY, which plays in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference and advanced to the national championship game of the National Christian Colleges Athletic Conference.

Jackson scored a season-high 34 points at the Apex Academy Challenge in Cherry Hill, New Jersey and averaged 13 points and 6 assists for the year. The heady floor general, who will play for Nyack Head Coach Ted Quinn, completed a remarkable season highlighted by five All-Tournament selections including top honors at the prestigious Nike iS8 Fall Classic in New York, the Hall of Fame Classic in Springfield, Massachusetts, and the Crossin Memorial Classic in Plymouth, Pennsylvania.

The 3.2 GPA student who also completed a full-year of college credits while enrolled at Princeton Day, closed the season by earning national All-Tournament honors at the NACA National Championships in Dayton, Tennessee and being named to the National Private School Athletic Association (NPSAA) Mid-Atlantic All-Regional team.

The former Lackey high school team captain along with his Princeton Day Storm teammates finished with a 33-3 record and a #6 national ranking by the NPSAA while helping PDA lay claim as the only private school in America to advance to two national title games this season (the NACA in Dayton, TN and the NCSAA in Erie, PA).

Earlier, Princeton Day announced that 6'9" forward Jon Underwood had signed to accept a scholarship to Missouri, which advanced to the NCAA Elite 8 in March, that 6'2" Dwayne Wheeler had signed to accept a scholarship to Charleston University in West Virginia, that Sheldon Thorne will be playing for Shenandoah University in Virginia, and that Angelo Robinson is attending Robert Morris University in Pennsylvania. Last season, Baltimore, Maryland native, Beloved Rogers earned a scholarship to Oral Roberts University after graduating from Princeton Day.

Head Coach Van Whitfield, Trainer Bill Wright and the Princeton Day Academy Storm congratulate Jamaur and his parents **Toronto and Donita Jackson** on this outstanding opportunity for yet another Former-Stormer to further his studies and earn a college degree.
